Postures at Mass The Archdiocese recommends "bowing our heads before receiving Communion" and then putting our hands or our tongue, out. *Holy Communion* may be received either on the tongue or in the hand (making as it were a "throne" for the Lord). The option of genuflecting before receiving Holy Communion is allowed. When we receive from the Chalice we should do similarly and then take the Chalice in both hands.

Whether we receive from one kind or under another, we receive the whole Christ, Body & Blood, Soul & Divinity, but the Sign of the Heavenly Banquet is greater under both species.

It is important to consume the Blessed Sacrament BEFORE we leave the Altar Rails. Would everyone please be aware of this directive (unless *Holy Communion* is being brought in a *pyx* to the *sick or housebound*).

First Friday Mass is on the Feast of the *Sacred Heart. Holy Cross Primary* will be present, animating the *Sacred Liturgy* and P4 Pupils will receive the *First Holy Communion* Certificates.
