Please note that in recent years, a number of Invocations have been added to the *Litany of Our Lady/* of Loretto: So after "Mother of divine grace" comes "Mother of hope;" after "Mother of Christ" comes "Mother of the Church" & then "Mother of mercy;" after "Refuge of sinners" comes "Solace of migrants," and after "Queen of the most holy Rosary" comes "Queen of families." [In this Parish, at the end of the *Litany* you may also add "Protectress of the People of Holy Cross, Croy."]

Over the next couple of weeks, in the Bulletin and on Youtube & Facebook members of the PPC will present each of these Ten "Nuclei" in a few sentences. Parishioners are invited to respond by Comments or by email (holycrosss.croy@rcag.org.uk) or by post (to the Chapel House).

After this members of the PPC will meet to discern how this parish should further participate in the process. We are meant to ask the *Holy Spirit* to guide us TOGETHER (see prayer below). In this sense, it is clear that the purpose of this *Synod* is not to produce more documents. Rather, it is intended to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make people's hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new & deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts, & restore strength to our hands for our common mission (PD, 32). Thus the objective of this *Synodal Process* is not only a series of exercises that start & stop, but rather a journey of growing authentically towards the communion and mission that God calls the Church to live out in the third millennium.
