NO TO NUCLEAR WEAPONS ECUMENICAL PEACE VIGIL

Justice and Peace Scotland: Free bus to "No To Nuclear Weapons"
ecumenical peace vigil – Booking essential! On Saturday 2nd
August we will gather at Faslane for a Christian peace vigil in opposition
to nuclear weapons. This ecumenical service of prayer, reflection, read-
ings, and hymns, led by Archbishop Nolan, The Primus of the Scottish
Episcopal Church and the Moderator of the General Assembly of the
Church of Scotland, will take place from 10.30am to 12 noon at the
South Gate of HM Naval Base Clyde. We are keen to have a large and
visible gathering at this year's vigil to mark 80 years since the atomic
bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. To make it easier for people to
attend, free transport is being provided by Justice & Peace Scotland and
