Service of the Word with Holy Communion: 10am on Mondays.

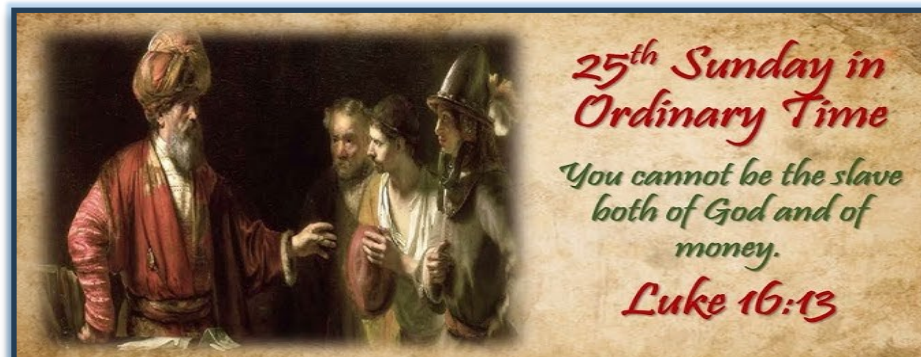
